Lunt: I have no issue with the Public Works Director who is on call 24/7, 365 days a year to take that vehicle home to be able to address any issues that may arise in a timely manner.

Branham: I don't know how much of a vehicle we would get for 16k.

Siria: From the budget it seems that we have the funds available for this purchase.

Brennan: These funds are partially from the sale of the previous PWA vehicle. I don't want to see the town limited to 16k and not getting a good quality vehicle.

	being able to bring any vehicle that may be over that amount to be approved.

- The water leak in the school parking lot has been repaired, a valve was replaced for the bus barn at the school, and 3 of the school meters were re-plumbed and fitted.
- Radio meter installation started on 10.21.24 and should be finished tentatively this week.
- 1 sewer line was jetted by Purcell PWA at Chickasaw and Kerby.
- The 2nd pump was installed, and a broken pipe was repaired at the Lift Station.

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- Terry McCracken is our new point of contact with Worth Hyrdochem. Worth Hydrochem met with me on 10.23.24. All pictures were taken at the wells, lift station, and water tower. Parts and electrical boards have been ordered.
- ORWA started manhole inspections on 10.23.24 and they have sent us their report on 11.05.24.

Town Clerk's Report presented by Town Clerk Kasey Lesher

- When the water rates increased last year, we had roughly 40k dollars in past due accounts. We now on average have 4k dollars in past due accounts. A decrease of 90%.
- In 2022 the Town of Washington had 1.59% customer growth, 5.91% in 2023 and up to October 31st Washington had 11.69% Customer growth.
